Maryland residents who need support with activities of daily living, such as bathing, grooming, dressing, and getting around. ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

Medical and Technical Criteria

- Individuals must reside in the community.
- Individuals must meet the level of care required to qualify for services in an institution.

Financial Criteria

- Individuals must qualify for Medicaid in the community
- Individuals can apply for Medicaid at anytime Individuals who receive Supplemental Security Income (SSI) are automatically eligible for Medicaid and do not need to apply
